1985 Memorandum by Commissioner Egger

Dear Sir or Madam:

This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act under 5 U.S.C. Section 552. The records sought and to what extent are described below and are related to my recent IRS FOIA request for a 1985 memorandum issued by Commissioner Roscoe L. Egger regarding the 16th Amendment (hereinafter my 16th Amendment FOIA Request):

1. All communications, letters, correspondence, emails and documents as described below between and among all IRS personnel and any other individuals and/or agencies, related to or discussing my 16th Amendment FOIA Request, from November 1, 2025, to August 1, 2026. These are to include but are not limited to documents, correspondence, and emails between and among IRS representatives E. Nicholson, T. Williams, Charles J. Brashear, Todd J. Lemmon, and/or Office of Government Information Services personnel and staff.
2. All communications, letters, correspondence, emails and documents as described below between and among all IRS personnel and any other individual and/or agencies, related to a similar FOIA request for the same Memorandum by Commissioner Egger from 1985 related to the 16th amendment filed by Aaron Siri, representatives of his organization, Siri & Glimstad LLP, and/or Del Bigtree, the Informed Consent Action Network (ICAN), and/or any other individuals and/or organizations, from April 24, 2026, to August 1, 2026.

As used herein, "documents" means written or electronic material, information, reports, studies and related documentation, together with any attachments thereto, electronic,

recorded. All written documents requested herein are requested in electronic PDF or PowerPoint format only, in a readable and searchable format, with active links.

If any or all documents do not exist, please note that specifically in your response. I request that you disclose these documents and materials as they become available to you, without waiting until all the documents have been assembled.

Please note that the FOIA provides that if only portions of a requested file are exempted from release, the remainder must still be released. I therefore request that I be provided with all non-exempt portions which are reasonably segregable. I further request that you describe any deleted or withheld material in detail and specify the statutory basis for the denial as well as your reasons for believing that the alleged statutory justification applies.

Please also separately state your reasons for not invoking your discretionary powers to release the requested documents in the public interest. Such statements may help to avoid unnecessary appeal and litigation. I reserve all rights to appeal the withholding or deletion of any information.

In order to help to determine my status to assess fees, you should know that I am an individual seeking information for personal use and not for commercial use. If there are any fees for searching or copying these records, please inform me if the cost will exceed \$10.00. I request a waiver of all fees for this request in that (a) disclosure of the requested information to me is in the public's interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to the public understanding of the operations and activities of your agency/department, and any potential effects of same on the public and their obligations under the 16th Amendment, (b) this information is not being sought for commercial purposes; and (c) the request is for such documents to be provided in electronic format.

I further request that all documents be provided by reply email to the following address: RicardoBeasV@hotmail.com.

If you deny any part of or this entire request, please cite each specific exemption you feel justifies the refusal to release the information and under what legal authority, and notify me of the appeal procedures available to me under the law.

Access to the requested records should be granted within twenty (20) business days from the date of your receipt of this letter/correspondence. Failure to respond in a timely manner shall be viewed as a denial of this request and I may immediately take further administrative or legal action. I look forward to your response within the 20 working days, as outlined by the applicable regulations. Furthermore, I specifically request that the agency provide me with an estimated date of completion for this request.
